

ARE YOU A DESCENDANT OF A PETERLOO PROTESTER?

At Peterloo at least 18 people were killed and over 700 seriously injured.

Ackerley, Samuel , 29 Lever-street [Manchester]: badly cut and wounded in both legs.

Allen, John , 59 Loom-street [Manchester]: trampled on very badly.

Allward, S. (male) : badly wounded by sabre or shot.

Amer, John , Tottington, near Bury.

Ball, Thomas , New Mount-street [Manchester]. Rope and twine manufacturer, 15 Mount-street.

Banks, William , Chester Gate, Stockport: aged 49 and a machine maker with 1 child. Left hip and foot hurt, head hurt by constables' truncheons. 5 days disabled. Thrown down by the pressure. 10/- received in relief.

Barton, Thomas , Swan-court, Stockport: rode down and two ribs broken.

Booth, John , Pitsworth [i.e. Pilsworth] Moor, near Bury: wounded in the back and under the right ear.

Clegg, Francis , Prestwich: thrown down and trampled on, seriously bruised by the pressure of the crowd. A person of some little property. [No relief awarded].

Collinge, Ann of Bowlee, near Middleton: very much crushed and bruised.

Crompton, James , Barton-upon-Irwell: trampled upon by the cavalry, dead. Buried 1 September.

Darlington, M. (female) : badly wounded by sabre or shot.

Downes, Margaret : dreadfully cut in the breast; secreted clandestinely, and not heard of, supposed dead.

Edwards, John , 2 Back Henry-street [Manchester]: aged 24 and a carder with 1 child. Beat by the constables on the face and throat. Was unable to swallow solids for some time. Disabled 1 week. Was four days imprisoned and then discharged. □1 received in relief.

Farren : a male child-in-arms of **Elizabeth Farren**. [See account of his injury in *Peterloo Massacre*, pp. 84–5: she was 'with her infant child at her breast . . . Seeing Mr Tebbutt . . . coming, she held her child down and prayed him to spare her infant'. As she was sabred on the head, 'her child fell from her arms, and received a severe contusion on the head, of which it is at this day suffering'.]

Garside, John , 119 Great Ancoats-street [Manchester]: thrown down and trampled on, his knee dislocated. An old man 62, with five children.

Harrison, William , 1 Crown-street [Manchester]: Special Constable, crushed and wounded.

Jackson, Isabella , 1 Union-street, Stockport: knocked down and trampled by horses. Hurt inwardly.

Jones, Edward , 139 Great Ancoats-street: aged 45. Shot in the thigh by the 88th Regiment as he was standing at his own door on 16 August. Still disabled. A respectable man supposed lame for life. □5 received in relief.

Kelly, John , 10 Clowes-street, Salford: aged 33 and a weaver with 2 children. Sabre-cut over his left eye, two inches long. He fell and was trampled on by the crowd. 5 weeks disabled. Spit blood for some time. □2 received in relief.

Lees, John , Oldham: sabred. Killed.

McGragh [McGrath], Sarah , and her child four years old: both thrown down and crushed.

Nuttal, John , Gee Cross: cut by the cavalry on the back of the head and on the right shoulder.

Oxley, Catherine , 55 George Leigh-street [Manchester]: aged 30 with 5 children. Thrown down and trampled on; right side hurt, head bruised so as to occasion deafness. □2 received in relief.

Partington [Parkinson], Martha , Eccles: crushed to death in a cellar-hole.

Pickering, John , 44 Bolton Moor: aged 49 with 10 children. Left arm and thigh hurt and bruised in the body. 2 weeks disabled. □1 received in relief.

Raffray, John , Lees: severe sabre-cut on the left side of the head. A young man and tailor.

Ravey, Mary , 333 Newton-lane [Manchester]: aged 36 with 4 children. Right arm bruised by being trampled on by the crowd. 2 days disabled. 10/- received in relief.

Rhodes, John , 3 Pits, Hopwood: sabre-wound on the head. Hunt (p. 87) presents him as killed.

Richardson 6, Thomas , 14 Blossom-street, Salford: aged 22 and an engraver with 2 children. Severe sabre-cut which severed the bridge of his nose completely down to his face.

Robinson, William , White Cross Bank [Salford]: bruised.

Roper, Catharine , 14 German-street [Manchester]: trampled down by the cavalry and bruised.

Royle, Esther , 5 Hanover-street [Manchester]: trampled upon and much bruised. A widow with 7 children.

Scholes, Ann , Block-lane, Oldham: thrown down and trampled on. Beat about the head with truncheons.

Scolfield, G. (male) : badly wounded by sabre or shot.

Settle, T. (male) : badly wounded by sabre or shot.

Slater, William , Ripponden: shoulder much bruised by the constables.

Stoddart, William , Tollbar-street, Stockport: aged 46 and chair-mender. Thrown down, right leg and thigh hurt and body bruised. 2 weeks disabled. □1 received in relief.

Taylor, Daniel , Haughton near Ashton: a severe sabre- wound on the head.

Teasdale, J. (male) : badly wounded by trampling of cavalry.

Thompson, Thomas , Bolton Moor: wounded in the eye.

Tomlinson, James , Coldhurst-lane, Oldham: severe sabre-cut on the top of the head. A single man, a hatter. 15/- final. Left to Mr Taylor.


Turner, Mary , 35 Hanover-street [Manchester]: very badly bruised.

Walkden, James , 74 Loom-street [Manchester]: stabbed in the back and bruised. Saw a fire into a house.

Webster, Daniel , 11 Rigby's Buildings [Salford]: crushed in the body.

Wheeler, Ann , 25 Spital-street, Newton-lane [Manchester]: breast and arm bruised by the constables.

Whitworth, James , Ashton: knocked down and vomited blood. A poor weaver with 4 children.
